



Important Milestones (2020)

- 25 January: First confirmed positive case (3, imported)
- 4 February: First local/Malasysian infected by Covid-19 (Singapore travel)
- 24 February: Mahathir resigned as PM
- 27 Feb 1 March: Gathering of Jamaah Tabligh in KL (Sri Petaling, 16,000)
- 29 February: Agong appoints Muhyiddin as PM
- 15 March: 190 new positive cases (dramatic increase)
- 18 March now: Movement Control Order (MCO)



Malaysian Government: Before MCO

- Temporary travel ban (China, Denmark, Iran, Italy, Japan, South Korea)
- Advisory not to travel to those countries
- Malaysians returning from above countries need to be quarantined for 14 days
- No public public gatherings/huge crowds
- Advise to exercise caution and practice good hygiene.

RESTRICTION OF MOVEMENT ORDER

IMPLEMENTED UNDER THE PREVENTION & CONTROL OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES ACT 1988

& THE POLICE ACT 1967

IN EFFECT FROM MARCH 18 - 31

PROHIBITS:



- The movement of persons & mass gatherings e.g. religious, sports, social & cultural
- All places of worship must close & halt activities including the Muslim Friday prayer
- All business premises except supermarkets, public markets, sundry & convenience shops must close



- Malaysians from going overseas
- Those returning from overseas must undergo a medical examination & self-quarantine for 14 days
- Foreign tourists/visitors banned from entering the country



- The operation of nurseries, government & private schools e.g. day schools, boarding schools, international schools, tahfiz centres & pre-university institutions
- Includes public & private higher education institutions, as well as skills training centres



- The operation of non-essential public & private premises
- Essential services like water, electricity, telecommunications, postal, transportation, irrigation, oil, gas, fuel, lubricants, broadcasting, finance, banking, health, pharmacies, the fire brigade, prisons, ports, airports, security & defences, cleaning, retail & food supplies allowed to remain open



- Drastic immediate action is required to stop the spread of COVID-19

- Everyone in Malaysia must comply with the order

- Close contact with food deliverer is inadvisable

Not allowed in public & private areas, including in gated areas

Outside therapy is allowed, but group therapy is prohibited



Houses of worship

All activity & prayers not allowed





IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANISATION (WHO) VIEW NOT TO END THE MCO PREMATURELY

UNDER THE EXTENSION



SELECTED ECONOMIC SECTORS ALLOWED TO REOPEN GRADUALLY

- Must adhere to health protection guidelines & strict restrictions on movement
- Approval will be cancelled for those who break the rules
- Sectors to be announced



SCHOOL'S OUT TILL THE SITUATION IMPROVES



BORDERS TIGHTENED, ESPECIALLY ILLEGAL CROSSING POINTS




Enhanced Movement Control Orders (EMCO) in Malaysia

BANTUAN PRIHATIN NASIONAL

- Pemberian tunai one-off dengan peruntukan hampir RM10 bilion
- Buat pertama kalinya disalurkan kepada kumpulan M40



RM1,600

kepada hampir 4 luta isi rumah berpendapatan bulanan RM4,000 & ke bawah, RM1,000 akan dibayar pada April & RM600 pada Mei



RM1,000

IMPROVEMENT OF ASSISTANCE FOR SMEs



Micro-credit scheme

- Abolishment of 2% interest to 0%, totaling RM500 million under Bank Simpanan Nasional
- Extended to TEKUN Nasional, a maximum of RM10,000 per company, 0% interest. Total funding of RM200 million

*Applicants can only choose one scheme to allow more people to benefit from it



3 25% reduction on levy for foreign workers

- For companies whose employees' work permit ends between April 1-Dec 31, 2020
- Not applicable to domestic help sector





 Rental waiver/discount by owner of private premises . For SMEs in retail sector

- During MCO period & 3 months after MCO ends
- Further tax exemption equal to the amount of rental discount for April-June 2020 will be given
- Rental discount must be at least 30% of usual rate



The government encourages consultation between employers & employees on working terms, including salary deduction options & unpaid leave during MCO period



- Deadline for handover of company's financial statement will be extended to 3 months after MCO ends
- For companies whose financial year ends Sept 30-Dec 31, 2019
- Must submit application to SSM
- No fee will be imposed for this extension





Other efforts by the Malaysian Govt

Roles of Non-State Actors/Civil Society

- Most of tasks have been fulfilled by the government
- MCO restricts volunteerism
- The government provides guidance for aid distribution

METHODS FOR NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANISATIONS (NGOS) TO DISTRIBUTE AID

NGOs must register at the nearest State Welfare Departments LIKMNI or district welfare offices (PKMD) a day before the aid distribution is done

NGOs that intend to contribute must be welfare-priented

Only dry goods and cooked

NGOs must adhere to the National Security Council (MKN) orders and follow Act 342:

To bring hand

An officer from People's Volunteer Corps [Rela] and Civil Defence Force (APM) will be escorting the NGO during the distribution, which will be coordinated by the Welfare Department (JKM)
